The Seymour Police Department has started a fund raising effort to enhance our Community Policing initiatives. Our community and the entire country are going through some very serious economic times. I feel obligated to ensure that our department continues to provide excellent quality community policing while being as fiscally responsible to the community's budget as well.

Therefore with the support of the Seymour Chamber of Commerce and with their sponsorship we have in progress a fund raising initiative to reduce the capital funding demands for the police department. I have been meeting with several businesses to request funding support for this initiative and to establish partnerships for funding an all terrain vehicle (ATV) community policing initiative. This ATV will be used to enable the department's officers to make contact and be approachable with the children and the community at large.
